Join us for Prokofiev's beloved musical story of "Peter and the Wolf." The Diablo Symphony Orchestra is delighted to welcome the talented bass and narrator Gregory Stapp and the Fratello Marionettes to tell this delightful and time-honored story. This family-friendly program includes Gregory Stapp's renditions of an entertaining selection of arias by Mozart and Gounod as well as songs from *South Pacific*.

The second half of the program features the magical and visually evocative *Fountains of Rome* by Italian composer Ottorino Respighi. This beautiful work describes, in sound,

four fountains in Rome as the day progresses from dawn to dusk. The composer uses the entire palette of the orchestra to paint the magical colors of light playing on water, all infused with a wonderful sense of feeling and emotion evoked by the beauty of a timeless city.

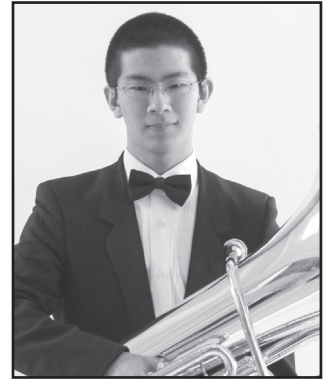
He's a Winner: Yen Liang Memorial Young Artist Competition

Around of applause and hearty congratulations to our 2014 Yen Liang Memorial Young Artist Competition winner in brass, Jonathan Lin! Lin, a junior at Monta Vista High School in Cupertino, started playing the tuba at the age of 11 and studies with Tony Clements of Symphony Silicon Valley. Lin is currently the principal tubist with the Senior Orchestra of the California Youth Symphony and will travel with the group on its 2014 concert tour of Croatia, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, and Slovenia.

In addition to orchestra, Lin also has broad performance experience with solos, wind symphony, and brass and chamber music ensembles and enjoys sharing his music with the community. He has been active with his high school's pep and marching bands as well as wind ensemble, where he has been a featured soloist in the past. He has been accepted into the California Band Director's Association (CBDA) 2014 All-State High School Honor Band and has held first-chair positions in the Santa Clara County Honor Band and the CBDA Junior High School All-State Honor Band. He received the highest rating of Command Performance for his solo in the 2012 California Music Educators Association Solo and Ensemble Festival.

Lin has been a regular member of the Ohlone College Tuba Ensemble since 2010 and has also played with the Cupertino Symphonic Band and the Mission Peak Brass Band. Since the summer of 2011, he has participated in the annual Humboldt State University Brass Chamber Music Workshop, learning from the coaches, rehearsing daily with fellow brass enthusiasts, and performing nightly in chamber music recitals.

Come enjoy the extraordinary talent of Jonathan Lin playing the rarely performed *Concerto for Tuba* by British composer Edward Gregson.
